Printed Books, one author 5.3.3:

Author's last name, First name. *Title*. Edition statement if not the first edition. City of publication:

Publisher, Publication year. Format.

Eck, Joe. *Our Life in Gardens*. New York: Farrar, Straus and Giroux, 2009. Print.

Printed Books, two or three authors, 5.3.4:

Author's last name, First name, Author's first name then Author's Last Name. *Title*. Edition statement.

City of publication: Publisher, Publication year. Format.

Hopkins, Keith and Mary Beard. *The Coliseum*. Cambridge: Harvard University Press, 2005. Print.

A work or chapter within an anthology, 5.5.6:

Author's last name, First name. "Title of the article or chapter or piece." *Title of the complete work*.

Ed. Name. City of publication: publisher, Publication year. Page range. Format.

Link, Kelly. "Louise's Ghost." *Poe's Children: the new horror anthology*. Ed. Peter Staub. New York: Doubleday, 2008. 329-362. Print.

Printed Books, one editor (multiple editors follow the same form as authors) 5.5.6:

Editor's last name, First name, ed. *Title*. Edition statement if not the first edition. City of publication:

Publisher, Publication Year. Format.

Worthington, Ian, ed. *A Companion to Greek Rhetoric*. Malden: Blackwell Publishers, 2007. Print.

A journal or magazine article through a library database, 5.6.4:

Author's last name, First name. "Article title." *Title of the publication*. Volume number:issue

number (Publication year): page range. *Name of the database*. Format. Date accessed.

Packer, George. "Risk Factors." *The New Yorker*. 84.41 (2009): 29-30. *Academic Search Complete*. Web. 7 July 2009.

A journal article through a found through a search engine, 5.6.3:

Author's last name, First name. "Article title." *Title of the publication*. Volume no.issue no.

(Publication year): page range or "n. pag." Format. Date accessed.

Travis, Jennifer. "The Trials of Law and Literature." *American Literary History Advanced Access*. 21 (2009): 345-354. Web. 7 July 2009.

Lim, Katherine. "False from head to foot: Aristotic Pretentiousness in Punch and The Way We Live Now." *Victorian Web.org* (1995): n. pag. Web. 8 July 2009.

A newspaper or magazine article found through a search engine, 5.6.2c:

Last name, First name. "Article Title." *Title of the magazine*. Publication day Month, publication year. Page range or n. pag. for "no page". Format. Date accessed.

Brown, Tina. "The Speaker is in the House." *Newsweek*. 16 May 2009: n. pag. Web. 8 July, 2009.

Online encyclopedia or dictionary, 5.6.2:

Author name, if any. "Article title." *Title of the website*, Sponsoring organization. Date of update of "n.d" for no date. Format. Date article is accessed.

Mayo Clinic Staff. "SAD: Seasonal Affective Disorder." *Mayo Clinic.com*, Mayo Clinic. 24 September, 2007. Web. 11 July, 2009.

Government document found online, 5.6.2.c:

Government. Department of that government. "Article title." *Website title*, Sponsoring organization. Date of last update of "n.d." for no date. Format. Date accessed.

United States. Dept. of Education. "Tidewater Community College Statistics." *College Navigator*, National Center for Education Statistics. n.d. Web. 8 July 2009.

General websites, section 5.6.2:

Author, if any. "Title of the article." *Title of the website*, Sponsoring organization or n.p if publisher is unknown. Date when webpage was updated OR n.d. for "no date." Format. Date accessed.

"Life Story." *Arthur Ashe.org*, n.p., n.d. Web. 8 July 2009.
