

ATTENTION!

Some activities require special training or screening.

--Anyone working with food service at the soup kitchens and Kids Café *in Portsmouth only* must get a **food handler's card** from the health dept (\$6—Oasis will reimburse). Contact city health dept. at 393-8585 to pre-register. Class meets 1st and 3rd Wednesday each month from 1:30 to 3:30. They will accept a faxed list of students for any advance registration. The Norfolk health card is also valid for this requirement (more varied class times)—call 683-2709 to hear the information.

--Anyone helping people with studying must attend a free **3-hour tutor training session** sponsored by the SL Office. These are offered during the 3rd through 8th weeks of the semester at varied times, at all 4 campuses, or in your classes. See SL calendar for dates and/or call 822-2443/2444.

--Those who provide tutoring through the Kids Café program must undergo **police/drug screening**, provided by the individual sites (free through Maryview Hospital in Portsmouth; for a \$15 non-refundable fee for South Hampton Roads B&G Clubs). B&G Clubs require an additional volunteer form for their records.

--The H.E.R. Shelter also requires **screening** and extensive forms; the director is willing to visit your classes to do forms all at once. Call Debbie Eddings at 485-1445.

--Anyone working directly with patients at the Dept Of Behavioral Healthcare Services (DBHS) must have more extensive **police/drug screening**; office workers are exempt. DBHS arranges and pays; call Elaine Breathwaite at 393-8618.

-- The Police Ride-along program through Professor Haley's Criminal Justice class requires a signed waiver, as does any participation at the overnight homeless shelter. Both forms are in the back of this manual.

-- The Virginia Marine Science Museum has an application and interview process. Service at this location is based upon selection.

-- The Norfolk Botanical Gardens requires additional volunteer forms including a waiver.

To clarify how Kids Café is structured:

The Kids Café is a special Foodbank program that coordinates sites in several cities to **both** feed children in the afternoons and provide homework help (tutoring).

For feeding: Food preparation and clean-up, Serving line - monitor temperatures and restock food, Dining room - interact with kids, assist smaller kids, keep order, clean and reset, Mentoring children - help with homework, teach life skills. This is primarily a TUTORING site.

The **Kids Café itself is the food service (food card, background check)**; when signing up, students should list **Kids Café plus site** (ex: Kids Café-Zion Baptist).

Students who want to tutor (tutor training, background check) should list **the individual program site, not Kids Cafe**: Boys & Girls Clubs, Zion Baptist Church, Brighton Rock AME Zion, Bettie F. Williams public school, Oakmont, etc.
