You can try a mint julep in many places in Lexington, and there are also a variety of pre-mixed versions. The julep even has its own special cup. (It has been a tradition in SACCR to present our Presidents an engraved julep cup. In Virginia, it is the Jefferson cup.)

Meet past and future Kentucky Derby winners and get a behind the scenes look at the multi-billion dollar thoroughbred industry on one of the many personalized horse farm tours.

Minutes, SACCR Executive Board Meeting Hyatt Regency, Lexington, Kentucky January 2-3, 2009

Members in Attendance: Patricia Goodman, Anita Kirkpatrick, Deborah Burks, Edie Carter, Gwen Aldridge, Larry Iaquinta, Linda Serra-Hagedorn, Nancy Beaver, Stephen Pople, and Judy Woods.

President Patricia Goodman called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m. She distributed agendas and welcomed board members and guests to Lexington.

Treasurer’s Report

Treasurer Anita Kirkpatrick presented the report and distributed handouts including (a) Profit and Loss Statement and (b) line items of income and expenditures. As of January 1, 2009, the balance of SACCR’s bank accounts are as follows: Checking, \$4,969.99, Money Market \$50, 264.19 for a total of \$55, 233.74. Nancy Beaver moved to accept the treasurer’s report and Deborah Josey-Burks seconded the motion.

Budget

Patricia Goodman reminded Board Members who have SACCR credit cards to check with Anita Kirkpatrick prior to making organizational-related purchases to ensure that the SACCR checking account will not be overdrawn.

Policies and Procedures

For the benefit of those unable to attend the January 2, 2009 working session on Policies and Procedures, the president presented the updates and revisions that were suggested during that session. Patricia Goodman agreed to write a draft of the revised Policies and Procedures and to send the document via e-mail for review by members of the Board. During the scheduled August 5, 2009 business meeting, SACCR membership will vote to accept or reject the revised policies and procedures.

Election of Officers

President Goodman named Gwen Aldridge to Chair the Nominating Committee for Officers for 2009-1010. The Chair will appoint two additional members to serve on the committee. The following positions are open for Nominations: President Elect, Secretary, and Member-at-Large for Program and Outstanding Paper Award. Requests for nominations will be solicited from SACCR members. The nomination process will include the submission of biographical information and résumé or vita. The nominating committee will select a slate of officers to be presented to the members for election.

The Research Awards Committee will select up to three (3) dissertations to receive an Outstanding Dissertation Award. In addition to a framed certificate, Outstanding Dissertation Award recipients will receive a modest cash stipend and be designated to represent SACCR in the Distinguished Research Sessions at one of the following:

- The Southern Association of Institutional Research (SAIR) Annual Conference
- The American Education Research Association (AERA) Annual Conference
- The Association for Institutional Research (AIR) Forum

Note: To be eligible for the cash stipend, award recipients must (1) present their dissertation at the SACCR annual conference; and (2) represent SACCR at the prescribed Distinguished Research Sessions.

Outstanding Dissertation Submissions

To be considered:

- Entrants must be current members of SACCR
- Entrants must be on the program of the Annual SACCR Conference to present their paper at the time of entry

- Entries must be concise and must conform to the guidelines as outlined in the APA Styles Manual, 5th edition, the Chicago Manual of Style, 15th edition, or the MLA Style Manual, 2nd edition
- Entries should be submitted electronically in Word or PDF format

Outstanding Dissertation Submissions

Dissertations submitted for consideration must include:

- A brief cover letter
- A recommendation from the dissertation chair
- An executive summary of the dissertation (10-20 pages) double spaced which includes:
 - ✓ Cover page with the title of the dissertation, name, and listing of all committee members
 - ✓ Description of methodology
 - ✓ Results
 - ✓ Conclusion
 - ✓ Bibliography

Award Selection

The following criteria will be used by the Outstanding Research Awards Committee to evaluate all submissions:

- **Theoretical or Conceptual Framework for the Study**
 - ✓ Is the theoretical framework logical and/or well reasoned?
 - ✓ Is there a theoretical justification for the approach used in the study?
 - ✓ Are major study concepts clearly operational?
 - ✓ Is an adequate review of the literature provided?
- **Methodology**
 - ✓ Is the methodology clear enough to allow this study to be replicated?
 - ✓ Is the methodology sound and in accordance with established practice?
 - ✓ Does the methodology afford a new or novel approach to data conceptualization and/or data analysis?
- **Organization of the Dissertation**
 - ✓ Does the dissertation have clarity of exposition?
 - ✓ Does the dissertation have a cohesive narrative?
 - ✓ Does the dissertation use the proper format (APA, Chicago, MLA, etc.)?
- **Relevance of the Topic to IR Discipline and/or Contribution to the Field of IR**
 - ✓ Does this dissertation have implications for the field of IR?

Note: To be eligible for the cash stipend, award recipients must (1) present their outstanding paper at the SACCR annual conference; and (2) represent SACCR at the prescribed Distinguished Paper Sessions.

Ronald Crouch, Director of the Kentucky State Data Center, Urban Studies Institute at the University of Louisville, will present the keynote address for this year's SACCR Conference. He is a dynamic, well known speaker who will provide us with much information to help us in this data driven environment.

Jeff Edmondson, Director of Strive Will Present Session on Education in the Future

Jeff Edmondson, serves as Executive Director of Strive, a coalition of postsecondary, K-12 business and non-profit organizations in Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky. The goal of the organization is to increase educational aspirations, achievement, and attainment of students throughout the region.

This is a very powerful project that will really make you think about how education is evolving. Education in the 21st Century is moving from a world of schooling to a world of learning. Knowledge Works Foundation has developed a forecast of what education may look like in the future and provides insights into what this shift may become. The Foundation has also supported a partnership called Strive that is laying enabling innovations that are consistent with the lessons found in the forecast. In this session participants will engage in a dialogue on the forecast and the partnership to help identify what learnings may be applicable to work in their communities.

Edmondson has a bachelor's of science in biology from the University of Richmond and a master's in public policy from Johns Hopkins University. In addition, he has served as a volunteer and supervisor for four years in Peace Corps, Gabon, Central Africa.

Pre-Conference Workshops

Workshop A – Survey Research for (intellectual) Dummies

Presenter: **Dr. Kenneth Royal**, Assistant Director, for the Office of Research at the University of Kentucky.

This three hour interactive, hands-on workshop will provide the essential of quality survey research. Topics to be explored include: item construction, scaling, measurement issues, instrument validation (validity and reliability), survey research ethics, sampling methods, statistical analyses of data, and the reporting of results. Workshop B – SACS Fifth-Year Interim Report

Presenter: **Dr. Michael Johnson**, Vice President, Commission on Colleges

This interactive session will provide information on preparing the fifth-year report required by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS). Lessons learned from the first cycle of institutions using the fifth-year report will also be discussed.

The workshops will be held on Sunday, August 2, from 1:00-4:00 p.m. Cost for a workshop will be \$50.00 for those attending the conference and \$75.00 for those attending only the workshop.
